Georgia Tech Finally Wises Up to Free Parking Between Kappa Sig and ZBT



As you may know, Ma Tech has decided to end Kappa Sig's tradition of double and triple parking on the sliver of gravel next to 182 Sixth Street. They began the work recently to convert the EC Lot into sixteen paved parking spaces, permit required. On a bad day, Kappa Sig and ZBT might have doubled that number of cars.

For something that's nothing more than a pit of small rocks, the EC Lot has been the site of countless memories over the decades. We know there are some good stories out there (band party musician stealing a brother's car, how the lot served as a pit to roast Homecoming pigs, etc.). In honor (or, should we say, in memory) of the EC Lot, we asked alumni to share their best stories of how you maximized your access to free parking at Tech, and any memorable or funny stories that ensued.

Thanks to **Doug Jory '84** for sharing his. He writes, "Sad to hear that Ma Tech is taking our lot. When I was in school I got a parking ticket for parking an unregistered vehicle in our lot. I went to the kangaroo appeals court to contest the ticket, and had to call in the

GT policeman who gave me the ticket because they didn't believe me when I told them I was ticketed in our lot. Since the officer was not at the initial hearing we had to reconvene a week or so later, at which point he confirmed that he ticketed me in our lot. I was able to convince the jurors hearing my appeal that this was private property and got the ticket thrown out. However, Ma Tech always gets her pound of flesh. Years later as an alum and parent I returned to the Tech campus to watch my daughters compete in the Gwinnett County countywide swim meet. I parked on the street in front of the Aquatics Center and received a ticket for parking an unregistered vehicle on campus. As an alum I laughed, tore up the ticket and ignored it. Ten years later when my oldest daughter enrolled at Tech and registered her hand-me-down 13-year-old car, she was told that she would first have to clear up the outstanding ticket. No appeals this go round. 'Cash on the barrel head'."

Alpha Tau Gives Back in a Big Way

Brothers Contribute 3,700 Hours and Raise \$10,773 for Campus and Local Charities

Alpha Tau continues to give back in a big way, participating in numerous philanthropy events on campus and in the community. So far this year brothers have been involved with Kappa Sigma Games, the Sam Birchfield Benefit Concert, the Alpha Xi 5K, and weekly events with Atlanta Mission, including a 5K Race to End Homelessness. So far this year, Alpha Tau brothers have contributed 3,700 hours and raised \$10,773 to our philanthropy efforts. Looking ahead to the remainder of 2016, brothers hope to drive more weekly participation, and grow Kappa Sigma Games to be even bigger.

Recruitment-wise, Alpha Tau has a larger-than-typical spring pledge class this year, not to mention one of the largest pledge classes on campus, with nine new members. The chapter held bonfires and lunches as part of their recruitment efforts, and boast one

of the highest rush attendances on campus. Looking ahead to fall, brothers have a goal to recruit a 25-man pledge class and are developing an extensive summer rush and bid process.

Brothers are working hard to strengthen relations with alumni, and enjoyed mingling with older graduates at numerous events this past fall—especially the chapter's 125th anniversary.

"As an undergraduate, I've always enjoyed hearing about crazy stories from the old house and some of the things that alumni were most proud of," said Chapter President Jared Metzger. "It's awesome to see a group of alumni come by and crack a few beers then hang out on the front porch on the weekends."


